

## More on UseR!

- Large amount of growth: 660 attended in 2015, planned for 750 in 2016 but 900 attended, 1,100 attended in 2017 and 2019
  - Reached max allowed in 2016, 2017 and 2019
  - Don't wait to register!
- Registration fee: Approximately \$150 for students
- For 2019: Of 467 submitted abstracts, 333 accepted
  - 141 oral presentations – 20 minute presentation via slides
  - 82 lightning talks – 5 minute presentation via slides, 15 slides automatically rotating every 20 seconds
  - 110 posters – Printed poster about 33" × 46", optional 30-second oral presentation with 1 slide
- Structure
  - Tuesday:
    - \* Tutorials (short courses) - Each are for a 1/2 day
    - \* No longer free, but low price (\$50?)
    - \* Examples: creating your own package, Rcpp, categorical data analysis, spatial analysis, Shiny
    - \* Some for beginners and some for intermediate users
  - Wednesday
    - \* 9AM Keynote
    - \* 11AM Contributed presentations
    - \* 2PM Contributed presentations
    - \* 4PM Keynote
  - Thursday: Same as Wednesday but poster session in evening
  - Friday: Same as Wednesday but 2nd keynote is at 2PM and ends conference

- Presentation idea for PhD students: Construct an R package associated with your dissertation. Present at UseR and/or write a paper for the *R Journal*
